**TRAFFIC CONTROL (BRIDGETOWN ALIVE DOOFLICKY)**  
**RULES, 2011**

The Commissioner, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 23(2) of the *Police Act*, with the approval of the Minister, makes the following Rules:

1. These Rules may be cited as the *Traffic Control (Bridgetown Alive Dooflicky) Rules, 2011*.

2. In these Rules,

“emergency vehicle” means a vehicle used by

- (a) the Barbados Red Cross;
- (b) the Department of Emergency Management; or
- (c) an ambulance service;

"relevant date" means Sunday, 3rd July, 2011;

“relevant period” means from 12:00 hours to 22:00 hours;

“vehicle” has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 of the *Road Traffic Act* Cap. 295.

3. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, the Bridgetown Alive Dooflicky will be held on Broad Street, in the parish of Saint Michael.

4. On the relevant date, during the relevant period,
- (a) Broad Street, from its junction with Prince Alfred Street to its junction with High Street;
  - (b) Prince William Henry Street;
  - (c) High Street;
  - (d) McGregor Street; and
  - (e) Milk Market,

in the parish of Saint Michael, shall be closed to all vehicular traffic.

5. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, no person shall park or allow a vehicle to remain stationary on any of the following roads, except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers:

- (a) Wharf Road;
- (b) Rickett Street;
- (c) High Street;
- (d) Prince William Henry Street;
- (e) McGregor Street;
- (f) Trafalgar Street;
- (g) Milk Market;
- (h) Prince Alfred Street; and
- (i) Chapel Street,

in the parish of Saint Michael.

6. All drivers and riders of vehicles, pedestrians and riders or leaders of animals using any of the roads specified in paragraph 5 shall exercise caution and shall comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform.

7. Any person who contravenes these Rules or fails to comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500 or to imprisonment for a term of 3 months.

8. These Rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Police Force, the Barbados Fire Service, the Barbados Defence Force or any emergency vehicle.
