1. This Act may be cited as the Barbados Boy Scouts Association (Incorporation) Act. Short title.

2. For the purposes of this Act—

Interpreta-
tion.

“ Association ” means the Barbados Boy Scouts Association ;

“ National Scout Constitution ” means the body of rules adopted at any time by the Barbados Boy Scouts Association as its constitution.

3. The present and all future members of the Association are hereby established a body corporate to which, subject to the National Scout Constitution, section 21 of the Interpretation Act applies. Incorporation.

4. Any person who—

Offences.

- (a) forms or organises any corps or body or works in connection with any corps or body that unlawfully claims, purports or holds itself out to be Boy Scouts or as being connected with the Association ;
- (b) is connected with the forming or organising of any corps or body that unlawfully claims or purports or holds itself out to be Boy Scouts or as being connected with the Association ;
- (c) falsely holds himself out or allows himself to be supposed to be a member of, or an agent for the Association for the purpose of soliciting, collecting or receiving money or material ;
- (d) without the authority of the Association wears, carries

or bears any uniform, token, emblem, badge or other distinguishing mark or any imitation thereof which under the bye-laws made under the National Scout Constitution is adopted by the Association for its use in such a manner as to convey the impression that such person is a member of, agent for, or otherwise connected with, the Association,

is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars or imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or both.
