CHAPTER 34A**SOLICITOR GENERAL (STATUTORY FUNCTIONS)**

An Act to provide for the performance of certain statutory functions by the Solicitor General of Barbados. 1980—62.

[17th November, 1980] Commence-
ment.

1. This Act may be cited as the *Solicitor General (Statutory Functions) Act*. Short title.

2. The person holding the office, permanently or otherwise, of Solicitor General shall perform all the duties and exercise all the powers, authority and jurisdiction imposed on or vested in the Official Assignee by law. Solicitor General to perform functions of Official Assignee.

3. The Solicitor General may by instrument published in the *Gazette* delegate all or any of the functions, except the power of delegation, conferred by this Act or any other law to another legal officer in the public service not being a person holding an office (however styled) lower than that of Deputy Solicitor General. Power of delegation.

4. Where in any Act or statutory instrument passed or made before 17th November, 1980, a reference is made to the Crown Solicitor, there shall be substituted therefor a reference to the Solicitor General. Reference to Crown Solicitor.
