**Authority:** This order was made on 25th August, 1959 by the Chief Agricultural Officer, after consultation with the Scotland District Soil Conservation Board, under section 6 of the *Soil Conservation (Scotland District) Act*.

**Commencement:** 1st October, 1959.

1. This Order may be cited as the *Soil Conservation (Scotland District) (Planting of Sugar-Cane, Grass and Trees) Order, 1959*.

2. No owner or occupier of any land within the area described in the *Schedule* shall, without the written permission of the Chief Agricultural Officer, prepare such land for the production of any description of crop or plant any trees, sugar-cane or grass thereon.

SCHEDULE

The area of approximately 3,760 acres contained within the boundary line beginning at a point on the seashore near Pico Teneriffe and following the boundary line between the parishes of St. Peter and St. Andrew, continuing on the same boundary line to the point where the said boundary line meets the highway from Rock Hall to Rock Hall village, continuing from that point along the highway to Rock Hall village, following the road from Rock Hall village to its junction with the main road from Turners Hall to St. Andrew's Church and thence following the road to St. Andrew's Church, turning south along the highway to the point where the Bawdens and River stream crosses the highway under the bridge near to the official residence of the Parochial Medical Officer for the parish of St. Andrew and then along the Bawdens and River stream to the point where it enters the sea, continuing from that point along the seashore to the starting point near Pico Teneriffe.
